Summary of Institution Mission and Student Achievement

The mission of the American Denturist College is to provide an exceptional education with a superior level of academic and technical education through distance modes of delivery, preparing students for immediate success and productivity in the workforce, for continuing formal education, and for lifelong learning.

The American Denturist College evaluates student achievement by monitoring performance measures, which include graduation rate, student academic progress, and State Licensure rates for graduates.

Aggregated Institutional Data on Student Achievement

The American Denturist College's diploma program is offered in a 1, 2, & 3 year program lengths. A student has up to 4.5 years to complete the program.

For cohorts enrolled 1/7/2013-6/20/2016, we had a total of 54 students enroll. 7 of those students left the program prematurely and 38 have graduated. Our Graduation rate for cohorts 2013-2016 is 82.20%.

Of those 38 Graduates, 30 (78.9%) have received Denturist Licensure in their respective States. 37.5% of those without Licensure live in States that have no Denturist Licensure pathway or other legal reason.

Student academic progress in the Didactic courses for the last completed term (Fall 2020), 100.00% of 23 students passed with 70% or above.

The ADC started a Bachelors of Technical Science (BTSc) 4 year and 1 year completion degree in 2020. There are currently 3 students progressing in the completion program (1 year). The BTSc has no graduates at this time.
